

Colonial Williamsburg's Golden Horseshoe Golf Club Hosts 23rd Annual Golden Horseshoe Invitational July 11-12



Williamsburg, Va. (June 30, 2015) – Colonial Williamsburg's Golden Horseshoe Golf Club hosts the 23rd Annual 2015 Golden Horseshoe Invitational, a 36-hole, four-ball stroke play event, July 11-12.

The popular tournament includes an open championship, a senior championship (both players age 50 and over as of July 11), and a super senior championship (both players 65 and over as of July 11). The field is limited to 56 teams.

Team entry fee is \$460 and includes practice rounds and two tournament rounds, golf carts for tournament rounds, tee gifts, prizes, Friday's Gold Course Clubhouse reception and putting contest, and lunch both days. Entry deadline is 5 p.m. Tuesday, July 7.

The Golden Horseshoe Golf Club is set in a Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary among Virginia hardwoods and the rolling terrain of the Tidewater region. The Gold Course, a classic designed by Robert Trent Jones Sr. more than 50 years ago, is located steps away from the Spa of Colonial Williamsburg, the Williamsburg Inn and the Williamsburg Lodge. The adjacent Green Course, designed by his son Rees Jones 25 years ago, represent the first father-son layout in the country. Jones Senior also designed the popular executive-length Spotswood Course.

Revenue from golf play on the Golden Horseshoe Golf Club's three public courses supports the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation's research, preservation and education initiatives.
